Pastor Detweiler's Message.....

From the *Interim Pastor*

Holy Week and Easter

Lent prepares us for the celebration of the events surrounding Jesus' death and resurrection in the Great Three Days (Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday) and Easter.

Holy Week begins with the Blessing and Procession with Palms on Palm Sunday. We enact Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem by blessing the palms in the Gathering Area, then processing into the church to "All Glory, Laud, and Honor." Once we arrive at our seats and listen to the scripture readings, the mood of the service begins to shift. That shift is completed as we read the passion according to Matthew, the story of the events surrounding Jesus' death.

When we gather on Maundy Thursday, we will conclude Lent as a time of repentance and renewal. At the conclusion of the Order for Confession and Forgiveness that begins the service, there will be an opportunity for individual absolution at the altar rail. We then move to remembering Jesus giving us the meal of Holy Communion as the way to remember him and know he is with us.

It is appropriate that some of the children of the congregation will be receiving Communion for the first time at this service. The Maundy Thursday service concludes with the removal of the altar appointments to symbolize the betrayal of Jesus that occurred after the meal that he shared with his disciples.

On Good Friday we will gather to celebrate the death of Jesus Christ, because it is through his death that we know the full extent of God's love for us. We will sing hymns traditional for this day, and read the passion according to John. John's passion account emphasizes Jesus' triumph through the cross, his "lifting up" in death that is completed by his resurrection and ascension. We will pray for ourselves and the whole world, and spend some time contemplating the cross and its meaning for us.

Having spent Holy Week in these reflections on the meaning of Christ's life and death for us, we can celebrate his resurrection and the promise of our sharing it on Easter Sunday with unrestrained joy!

Forming young people as Christians

Hope has an unusually young membership for a Lutheran church in the eastern United States. That was one of the discoveries of the Transition Team. I am sure that is a result of the long history of the Hope Christian School and the emphasis on ministries with children and youth that has characterized this congregation.

For a long time we placed those ministries that followed baptism within the area of Christian Education. Now we are more likely to use the term "**Christian formation.**" Everything we do as a congregation, especially our worship, forms us as followers of Christ, and that formation is a lifelong process.

It starts with the promises made at baptism. Those promises include living with God's people, regular participation in worship, and reading the Bible and prayer, so that we learn to trust God and proclaim Christ through our words and actions. We are formed as Christians - followers of Christ - by our participation in the life of the people of God, the body of Christ, which is the church.

This congregation is serious about helping parents and children keep the baptismal promises and grow as followers of Christ.

- We give story Bibles to young children and their parents, so they can begin to learn about God and God's people.
- At third grade, we prepare children for participation in Holy Communion,
- and we give them their own first Bible.
- Confirmation is a two or three-year process of formation that includes regular worship attendance, study, and serving in Christ's name.
- We offer short term learning opportunities: Bible studies and topical discussions
- The Gathering of Men and Women of Hope devote some of their meeting time to Bible study.

These activities are not ends in themselves: their purpose is to form us as people who worship the God of Jesus Christ regularly, and live lives of gratitude and service. Everything we do is to engage us in the central activity of worship. May we continue to be formed as God's people in Freehold so we can faithfully serve in Christ's name!







# Report from the Call Committee

The Call Committee has been active. We met with assistant to the Bishop, Aaron Richter, to review the synod's call process. We then discussed Hope's Mission Site Profile. Since then we have been provided a candidate's Rostered Minister Profile. We discussed this profile in some detail and determined that it was not the best match for Hope at this time. We informed Pastor Richter, and are awaiting the Profile of another candidate.



## *Notes from Worship Planning*

1. We are going to try a new flow for communion: serving the right (street) side fully before have the left (parking lot) side go to the communion rail. This is similar to what we do on Sundays when there is no center communion rail. We hope this will streamline communion. *We are interested in your responses.*
2. We would like to form a committee to deal with our (many) worship banners. Some need repair, some need replacement. If you are interested contact **John Drager or Diane Kless.**
3. This year marks the **500<sup>th</sup> Anniversary** of the **Protestant Reformation**. We are exploring a number of opportunities to commemorate this event

HOPE CHRISTIAN SCHOOL TRAFFIC PATTERN

The Traffic Pattern was designed (30 years ago) to expedite the drop off and pick up of the children. It takes several days of training for everyone to get the pattern to flow properly. If you arrive during drop off (8:45-9:15 am) and pick up (11:15-11:40 am & 2:45-3:15 pm), you will notice the cars are lined up in order of their teacher entrance (Fellowship Hall door and main entrance). You will need to wait your turn to park in the lot. This traffic pattern also alleviates the back up on Elton-Adelphia Road. With 90 plus children enrolled any given day, means many vehicles are in the driveway during these designated times. Please be patient or plan your visit to the church between 9:15 & 11 am, during the lunch hour thru 2:30 pm and after 3:15 pm.

FREEHOLD AREA OPEN DOOR FOOD PANTRY REPORT

In February, we served **465** adults and **204** children for a total of **669** people with a three-day supply of food. Our clients are allowed to come every day for produce and bakery items.

We received another **\$10,000** donation from Foodstock. Also **\$1,500** from the Born to Run Race that was held in November and \$3,000 from the Brooklyn pharmacist who contributes regularly.

Our After-School Program had **28** children, with **20** adults and **21** high school volunteers in February. (*Editor's note: HCS and Scholastic Book Fairs contribute several books from the "all for books" proceeds which equated to \$75 this past October – we purchased books from the shelves of the Fair and gave to this After-School program*). We need more prizes for boy and girls grades 3-4-5. Among their favorites are: colored pencils, markers, maps, puzzles and novelty gadgets. They are awarded prizes for winning specific math and spelling games; book reports; perfect attendance; exceptional articles for their newspaper and best thank-you notes written each week (one for content and one for presentation).

Our **Advocacy Director** reported interviewing about **20** people during February and March. Eleven people were helped with finances, seven were helped with rent, three with utilities and one with prescriptions. Three people are on a waiting list for Emergency Food and Shelter Program.
