Pastor Detweiler's Message...... From the **Interim Pastor**

Transition Update

Our Transition Team completed their work of preparing the Ministry Site Profile and a Pastor's job description in December and submitted both of these to Council for their approval. The Council acted to approve them at their December meeting and they were submitted to the New Jersey Synod.

On Tuesday, January 10, the Council and Transition Team met with Pastor Aaron Richter from the Synod office to review the two documents. As the synod staff considers candidates to recommend to Hope, it is helpful for them to know what is behind the statements in the Ministry Site Profile. This meeting provided Pastor Richter with an opportunity to understand Hope and its leaders, and what are your hopes and dreams for the future. The next step is for Pastor Richter to meet with the Call Committee. The composition of that committee will be finalized at the January 23 Council meeting. It is expected that they could be considering their first candidate by late February.

This process has moved quickly at Hope because of the capable work of the Transition Team. Dave Lynch chaired the team and kept the process moving via email between meetings. The team members - *Brian McMillin, Chelsea Zigler, Debbie Crawford, Gerry Bergh, and Suzy Coulter* - worked together comfortably. They had some very frank discussions, and produced a profile that honestly portrays Hope as a congregation with much potential and a young membership, but looking for clear direction and goals for the future.

We have no idea how long the call process will take. It could be over in a few months, or it could take many months. Since seminaries are producing fewer pastors than the number who retire each year, there are always many congregations looking for pastors. The most important thing we can do as members of the congregation is to pray for the guidance of the Holy Spirit, and to be patient. As a Spirit led process, it cannot be rushed. We can pray every day that the Holy Spirit will guide the Call Committee, and will move in the heart of the person who is being called to be the next pastor of Hope. Please join me in prayer every day for our Call Committee, and for the next pastor.





The camp offered these youth the opportunity to participate in the same activities as other campers, but instead of using the regular summer curriculum, Bible studies were specifically geared toward them. "On the first night of camp, we talked about the bad names the world often uses for people with disabilities and discussed how they hurt us," shared the Rev. Brian Krause, the lead pastor of the program. "We then discovered that Jesus is the one who takes away all of those negative labels in his own body on the cross. In return, he gives us new names – Child of God, Son, Daughter, Royal Priest and Chosen." The Fellowship Hall has a classroom for HCS students.
