Pastor Detweiler's Message.....

From the *Interim Pastor*

It has been an interesting year! My job has been to help Hope come to terms with the enormous changes that have taken place within and around the congregation in the last few years. That could be summarized as bringing the many new members (most of them from Grace) into the fellowship circle of the congregation, and moving us from seeing ourselves as a "Mom and Pop" organization that operates somewhat informally as a "family", to seeing ourselves as a community of faith in Christ with a professional staff that operates according to written standard procedures. The role of that professional staff is to recruit and support volunteers who carry out our ministry in Christ's name.

On the basis of Hope's average Sunday attendance, one would expect the budget to be about \$300,000. Instead it is roughly \$750,000 because of the Hope Christian School. Similarly, a congregation of our size would typically have one full time employee (the pastor) and three-part time employees. Instead we have five full time and eighteen part time employees, again because of our school.

Some are mourning the loss of the family feeling of a congregation that had little paid staff. Actually, volunteers still do most of the work of the congregation, but as Hope grew, paid staff was needed to coordinate that work. Once a congregation has an attendance over 100 a Sunday, it has become too large for everyone to know each other. (It is similar in families: I have 70 first cousins. I know the older thirty of them, but not the younger forty.)

It takes at least 15 volunteers to make worship happen when we have two services on a Sunday. We have an additional 12 people teaching Sunday School each week. Every activity requires additional volunteers to coordinate participation. I estimate that we have about 100 volunteers working in our various ministries inside and outside the congregation. (We have 35 involved in Emergency Housing, 15 with Sunday School, 15 in the Choir, plus ushers, greeters, etc.) Most of them are unseen and unrecognized, but their work is an important witness to Christ among us nevertheless.

My year began by working with the Transition Team of Dave Lynch, Brian McMillin, Chelsea Ziglar, Debbie Crawford, Suzy Coulter, and Gerry Bergh. They worked hard to get a sense of the congregation and the Freehold community setting so they could assemble the Ministry Site Profile that is submitted to the New Jersey Synod office to begin the search for the next pastor.

They discovered that half the congregation is under 35 years of age, unusual for Protestant congregations today, and a contrast to the aging congregational leadership that they also noted. While we participate in many mission programs, we lack a strategic plan or clear goals for the future. They expressed the hope that goals will be set after a new pastor arrives.

Although Hope Christian School is part of Hope Lutheran Church's DNA, the Transition Team pointed out the need to integrate the school with our other ministries, and to engage younger members in participation and leadership. It is the school that has brought many of our younger families to us. For a church school to be successful, it has to be the primary mission focus of the sponsoring congregation. When a school operation is well integrated into a congregation's mission, it strengthens the congregation by bringing a steady stream of younger people into the congregation.

At the April Council meeting, I announced that I would be completing my interim at Hope on June 30. I believe that I have accomplished what I can here, and expect you will be calling your next pastor soon. You have a strong Call Committee working with the synod leadership to discern the call of the next pastor.

In addition, our Minister of Music, Dean Poulsen, will be leaving us August 31. We are grateful for the nine years he has served this congregation, and will be looking for a replacement who will help our children and youth be involved in our worship and music.

Our long-term Office Administrator, Wanda Nebiolo, has announced her plan to retire October 31. Wanda has been indispensable to the operation of the church and school, and has served faithfully many years! For that reason, the Council began the transition in office staff with the hiring of a part time Communications Director, Kathryn Johnson, in January. Kathryn has been working on enhancing the capabilities of our website and developing our Facebook presence. Over the summer, she will be taking over the other communications responsibilities. Also, recognizing the time pressures on both the office staff and our congregational Treasurer, a part time bookkeeper, Stephanie Siino, was hired in January.

Shifts in leadership are typical of transitions between pastors, but filling seven of twelve Council positions and changing office, music and pastoral staff in the span of a few months is unusual. But then, Hope's situation is quite unusual:

- A third of the people attending worship now were not attending a little more than a year ago
- More than 100 people joined Hope a year ago, most of them from Grace
- Hope has only had two pastors in 50 years. It would be more typical to have had five pastors in that span of years.
- Hope Christian School has experienced exponential growth in the last five years, stretching the use of our facilities and our staff.

With our school enrollment being consistently full, and the closing of KinderCare next door to us, questions have arisen about growing the school. It is a question that will be answered as your next pastor arrives. It is related to the need for goals and a plan for the future. The Transition Team developed a preliminary answer to the question of what Hope will be for the future. A more complete vision that integrates Hope Christian School more fully needs to be developed in the next several years. I have confidence that the Council will lead you in this project so Hope can be a faithful witness to Jesus Christ in Freehold for many years to come.

JUNE 14

In the United States, **Flag Day** is celebrated on June 14. It commemorates the adoption of the flag of the United States, which happened on June 14, 1777, by resolution of the Second Continental Congress. The

United States Army also celebrates the U.S. Army Birthdays on this date; Congress adopted "the American continental army" after reaching a consensus position in the Committee of the Whole on June 14, 1775.

In 1916, the president of the United States issued a proclamation that officially established June 14 as Flag Day; in August 1949, National Flag Day was established by an Act of Congress. Flag Day is not an official federal holiday. However, it is at the president's discretion to officially proclaim the observance. On June 14, 1937, Pennsylvania became the first U.S. state to celebrate Flag Day as a state holiday, beginning in the town of Rennerdale. New York Statutes designate the second Sunday in June as Flag Day, a state holiday.

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

#### Notes from Worship Planning by John Drager, Council Chair

- We continue to try a new flow for communion: serving the right (street) side fully at first, and the left (parking lot) side second. This is similar to what we do on Sundays when there is no center communion rail. We hope this will streamline communion.
- By now you KNOW we have returned to a single service at 9:30 AM for the summer. This is a great time to reunite with those OTHER members who attend the OTHER service (or to catch the truants). When Sunday School resumes in the Fall, we will return to two services.
- Pastor George's last Sunday with us will be June 25. Please plan to attend and wish him farewell. (Have some cake too)
- We will continue snacks, etc., after the single service. Don't hurry off. Stay and smooze a while.
- Please plan to attend worship on July 23 and welcome the Messengers Dance Ministers from Abiding Peace Lutheran Church. They will show us this form of ministry.

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- o Religion is our total response to our creator. Sacred dance is one way of interpreting this response.
- o Sacred dance is worship through symbolic movement. A symbol is a reality that has meaning beyond its own existence.
- Symbolic movements may express adoration, joy, prayer, penitence, anger, despair or any other mood.
- The dance choir is concerned with the exploration of movement as an interpretation of religious responses, ideas and moods of worship.
- The choir member uses the human body as an instrument of communication, as a language of movement.
- Hope has had its own interpretive dance choir over the years, the most recent one being led by *Erika Pranzo*.

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#### Wanda Nebiolo is Retiring in October!

When I was hired (it will be 29 years this October) we were typing the Sunday bulletins and newsletters on a typewriter. The newsletter information was accumulated by the office in handwritten form, but Connie Paul prepared everything for publication of the Anchor on her typewriter. Bulletins were typed on a word processing typewriter with a single page and copied on a bulletin cover. It was increased to include an insert as more activities were happening here at Hope.

Within the first year, I introduced the first computer to help make processing all documents easier and we purchased a digital-color duplicator. Once the computer was in place, Connie felt our efforts (mine and hers) were being duplicated, so the office began to prepare the Anchor for distribution as Word Documents. Really, it was redundant as the office is 'information central' and 'always in the know'. The computer made typing and saving the documents so much easier and the next-monthly Anchor began being built when the current newsletter was complete. This was so logical and continues to happen today.

As time marched on, we eventually leased a copier that collated, stapled and folded each bulletin and newsletter. The digital duplicating machine eventually wore out and was sent to the grave yard. Until about four years ago, we were mailing 440 copies of the Anchor to members and visitors. Now we are mailing 237 (we need to stay at the 200 mark in order to qualify for bulk mailings) to members and visitors who don't have or didn't give us an email address (or to those who would rather have a hard copy) and emailing 290 members and friends.

The Sunday bulletins have evolved from the single page to a two page, then 21 pages for an all-inclusive bulletin which meant everything was cut/pasted into the bulletin, now there is a fifteen-page semi-inclusive bulletin. The office prepares large-print bulletins for those who would prefer using the larger print.

Many jobs have been added over the years which means there is always something happening every day and <u>never</u> a dull moment. Since the office is 'information central' and in the 'need to know', I've attended Church Council, Worship Planning and other meetings in order to obtain information first hand. Maintaining the building is very important and working with the Maintenance Chair on Church Council is a necessity. Those duties added over the years are: Payroll, Vanco (Simply Giving), writing procedures for cash handling and returned checks, web-site updates, Hope's Directory, 1096/1099 preparation

This has been a great tenure and I thank the Hope Family for being a part of my life and supporting this position as well as being here for me always. I consider you as my family and I love you. You are in my thoughts and prayers. I will miss the office work, the staff and the little children who attend HCS. I will see most of you on Sundays and during church events.

I'm hoping for the opportunity to train someone for the varied duties and tasks that are accomplished by this position, so the transition is smooth.

I plan to enjoy my retirement with lots of traveling!
