## Pastor Detweiler's Message.....

#### From the Interim Pastor

#### **Transition Update**

*Pastor Aaron Richter* from the New Jersey Synod has met with the Call Committee. That committee is composed of *John Drager* (chair), *Art Casement, Erica Driscoll, Brian McMillan, Sue Sprunger and Chelsea Zigler.* It is expected that they will receive the name of a candidate by late February. In this synod, names are submitted one at a time, with both the congregation and candidate having to decide whether or not to go forward without the possibility of looking elsewhere first.

Some of you have asked me why more names are not submitted at one time so the Call Committee can compare candidates. One reason is that this is about discernment guided by the Holy Spirit. It is not just a hiring process. We believe that the Holy Spirit calls, gathers, enlightens and makes the church holy. The selection of pastors is part of that process. It is not a matter of picking the best one available at the time you are looking. That might not produce a good match.

Another reason is simply practical: when one name is submitted at a time, both the candidate and congregation are bound to consider only each other. When there are multiple names submitted, those candidates are free to be considering other congregations simultaneously. I have told some of you about the interim congregation I served that received four candidates' names, and by the time they finished interviewing the last one, all four had accepted other calls or decided to stay where they were. The last time Hope was seeking a pastor, there were many pastors available. That is not the case now. Seminaries are producing fewer pastors than the number who retire each year. Consequently, there are many open congregations and fewer available pastors.

We have no idea how long the call process will take. It could be over in a few months, or it could take many months. Additionally, it is a confidential process, which means the Call Committee can say nothing about candidates as it proceeds. The most important thing we can do as members of the congregation is to pray for the guidance of the Holy Spirit, and to be patient. As this is a Spirit led process, it cannot be rushed. We can pray every day that the Holy Spirit will guide the Call Committee, and will move in the heart of the person who is being called to be the next pastor of Hope. Please join me in prayer every day for our Call Committee, and for the next pastor.

### **Christian Education/Formation and Confirmation**

At a recent confirmation planning meeting, some of the parents and I discussed the program and the challenges of engaging young people and their parents. We talked about the need to connect our confirmation program more firmly to our worship life and the challenges of doing so. For example, the Bible learning part of the confirmation program is taught on Sunday mornings by a rotating group of leaders (*John Drager, Bob Cory, Rebekah Heilman-Mancini & Chelsea Zigler*), but only half of the evening confirmation class attends. That means that half of the group is missing half of the learning.

*Continued from page 2...... Pastor Detweiler's Message* My perception is that we (by "we" I mean most congregations) take too much for granted. We assume people know what is expected of Christians, when in fact we haven't specifically told them lately. And that renders our attempts at forming young and new Christians ineffective.

There are five disciplines that define us as disciples of Jesus:

- Worship with other Christians weekly
- Read the Bible every day
- Pray every day
- Give of ourselves and what we have, seeking to grow as followers of Jesus.
- Care for others and the world, working for justice and peace.

At baptism we promise to take on these disciplines and teach them to our children. Sunday School, communion instruction, confirmation and youth ministries are to help us keep those promises. The first one is primary. Without regular worship, we are unlikely to maintain the other disciplines.

In my forty plus years as a pastor, I have seen dramatic cultural change. Since it has taken place gradually, many of us do not notice how it has changed us. People today are away from home much more than they were 40 years ago. Few attend worship even three times a month. And sports have replaced religion as the primary center of meaning in our culture.

Today one is more likely to read in someone's obituary about the sports team to which they were devoted than about their church membership. People are buried in the jersey of their favorite team. Community is found in attending sports events or by participating in a sports team, rather than by participating in the life of a congregation. Parents often hope their child will earn a sports scholarship to help pay for college.

Sports, of course, does not offer the promise of eternal life. That is found only in baptism and following Jesus on the way to death and resurrection. All of us are making choices about finding meaning for our lives and the source of our hope every day - this is not only an issue for young parents, but for all of us. We are teaching the young people in our circle by the choices we make: whether or not to go to worship, whether or not to participate in that Bible study, whether or not to read a Bible story to our children or grandchildren.

We are living in a challenging environment for nurturing Christian faith. Living as a follower of Jesus - practicing those disciplines listed above - requires choices which are sometimes unpopular. But as a Christian community, we are called to encourage one another in living faithful lives, and in choosing to be an active participant in a community of faith in Jesus Christ, the only one who promises eternal life with God. Encouraging that participation is the goal of our ministries with children, youth and parents.

#### Freehold AREA OPEN DOOR Report

Submitted by Sandy Taylor, Trustee & VP Last month we served 751 people with a three-day supply of food. That is 275 households. The holiday gift program went smoothly again this year, thanks to the efforts of Judy Schimmal and her committee. Margie Golden, and the parishioners of St. Robert's Church who donated the bulk of the gifts. The Freehold Raceway Park jockeys, owners, trainers and employees donated funds to purchase bicycles. Gifts were provided for 176 children in 86 families. ShopRite gift cards were given to the neediest of our families. The estimated value of donated food for 2016 was \$251,997.00, using Feeding America's valuation of \$1.67 per pound.

Our new Advocacy Program Director, *Erika Woods*, is hard at work and doing a great job. She has seen 20 people in two weeks and has given financial help to eight families. Three cases are still pending, with the remaining being referred/denied, or provide other types of assistance.

Rev. Loraine Priestly-Smith said the Emergency Housing Program for homeless men began on December 1. They have set up office space with donations of three computers and furniture. They also have donations of back-packs for the men. There will be a professional security guard on site each night. Walgreen's has given the men free flu shots.
