Pastor Kropa's Message..... GETTING TO KNOW YOU!

One of the more memorable numbers in the hit Broadway musical *The King and I* was entitled "Getting to Know You." Two lines in particular came to mind when I sat down to write this, my first newsletter article here at Hope. They go like this:

Getting to know you Getting to know all about you

You see, I believe that one of my first tasks as your pastor – perhaps my main task initially – is simply taking the time and making the commitment to get to know you and, in turn, make it possible for you to get to know me. This will not happen overnight, I realize, nor will it be accomplished with just a few, short interactions. So it will require some intentionality on both of our parts. For me, it will require making myself available to visit with all of you in your homes, or offices and places of employment, or anywhere else that seems to make the most sense. For your part, I would merely ask that you think about the best time and place for us to meet in order to spend some time getting to know each other.

Of course, for many, if not most of you, this will involve my coming to visit in your homes and having the chance to meet your entire family. For others, however, meeting for coffee or lunch, or stopping by your workplace, might make more sense. I'll leave that up to you.

I am going to start this process by first spending some time getting to know the members of the Call Committee, who have agreed to serve as my initial "Pastoral Relations Committee," and also the Congregation Council. I hope to accomplish these visits/ contacts by the end of September. At that point, I will then begin visiting with everyone else in the congregation.

In order to facilitate this, beginning in October I want you to look for a sign-up sheet that will be posted on my office door indicating the days and times during the upcoming week that I will be available. This way you can check your own schedules and availability and "sign up" for an appointment time that works best for you. Don't worry if you're not available right away. We have plenty of time to do this. Again, it's not going to happen overnight. It will take a while, months I'm sure, for me to get around to all of you.

Just so you know, there are two basic goals that I have set for these visits. The first, again, is simply to get to know all about you; where you're from, what you like to do, etc.

My second goal, however, is to also spend some time specifically talking with you about Hope:

• What do you feel are the main challenges facing our congregation at the present time?

- What is your dream or vision for Hope's future?
- Are there any programs or ministries that you *personally* have a need for, or interest in, that aren't currently available at Hope?

While there may also be some formal fellowship events to help us get to know each other, not to mention informal conversations on Sunday mornings, I nevertheless feel that these one-on-one visits are also a great way to help us to get to know each other.


Needless to say, I'm really looking forward to it!

Bosnia and Herzegovina 2017: Where I found the presence of God

Being a nature lover, I found God in the beautiful mountains, flowing rivers, and the lush gardens and rose bushes, in the children of Bosnia and Herzegovina; the big smiles, their voices as we sang music with Larry Olsen from Dakota Road, Nicole Seitz, and Scott Weiss, their curiosity of these strange Americans, their expressions of peace while making the peace mandalas with Chelsea Zigler, their laughter as they played games with Sean Rifenburg & Tyler Sterrett, their participation in Dr. Seuss's Sneetches play performed by Casey McCormick & Tanya Hedderman. In the relationships that I built with some of the adult participants on the trip; Bishop Tracie Bartholomew, Pastor Jill Collict, Cindy Henry, Shelby Matioli, and Azra Saje, they helped me to care for our young adults in body and spirit and kept me sane. I found God in the strangers that open their hearts and shared their pain with us.

There is one special relationship that I made with a young interpreter, *Lazar*, a Serbian from Banja Luka, Bosnia and Herzegovina. Lazar, about 20 years old, has been an interpreter for the trip for several years. Lazar and I talked on the long bus rides, many dinners, and visits to café's. As I got to know him I could see the man behind the mask. He shared personal stories and what it is like for a young adult living in Bosnia and Herzegovina. Lazar gave us a tour of Sarajevo and shared his church with us, Serbian Orthodox, and many of his traditions. He shared a video from Christmas. His family gathers in the country and before the break of dawn the boys and men go by horse and sleigh to chop down a tree. Then they bring it back to burn in a great bonfire, giant yule tide log. Everyone is covered head to toe in traditional furs and woolens. The women

serve drinks and food, everyone is joyous. No one seemed unhappy about the bitter cold or snow on the ground. I observed Lazar bonding with each of our Hope travel team members. He is generous, funny, loving, compassionate, caring, and respectful.

When our Friendship Camps came to an end, the entire travel team gathered for a final farewell where we were asked to share who we appreciated. I knew immediately it was Lazar. I soon came to realize that Lazar was my Bosnian son, and for the short time we were together he carried a heavy burden that was on my heart. With my husband's surgery just 3 weeks prior to the trip and with all of the preparations, I did not have time to process that my son *Stanley* will leave for the Army two weeks after I return. Lazar's friendship eased my burdens so that I could be fully present and joyous while away from my family. Through Lazar's friendship I am reminded that God is there, even when we are not looking. God will carry our burdens.

"Carry each other's burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ", Galatians 6:2

After 9 years of sharing stories about the servant trip it was such a joy to finally share those experiences with such a wonderful group of youth. Thank you to everyone for making this trip possible. We had each of you in our hearts as we served the children of Bosnia and Herzegovina, and in that way you were present with us. We look forward to sharing more stories with you.
