PRESERVE THE CORE / STIMULATE PROGRESS

This is a phrase that originated with and was popularized by well-known author Jim Collins, who writes about the keys to organizational sustainability and growth. On his website, Collins defines it in this way:

"Preserve the Core/Stimulate Progress is a concept developed in the book *Built to Last*. Enduring great organizations exhibit a dynamic duality. On the one hand, they have a set of timeless core values and purpose that remain constant over time. On the other hand, they have a relentless drive for progress—change, improvement, innovation, and renewal. Great organizations keep clear the difference between their core values (which never change), and operating strategies and cultural practices (which endlessly adapt to a changing world)."

Of course, the question you may be asking yourself right about now is: What does this have

to do with the Christian Church, in general, and Hope Lutheran, in particular? And the short answer is simply this: Mainline denominations (which include the ELCA) have been really struggling in recent decades with these very issues of sustainability and growth that Jim Collins writes about. For example,

Christian Church (Disciples of Christ)

In 1965, the CC(DoC) had $\underline{1,918,471}$ members. In 2012, the membership was $\underline{625,252}$, a decline of 67 percent.

Reformed Church in America

In 1967, the RCA had $\underline{384,751}$ members. In 2014, the membership was $\underline{145,466}$, a decline of 62 percent.

United Church of Christ (Congregationalist)

In 1965, the UCC had <u>2,070,413</u> members. In 2012, there were <u>998,906</u> members, a decline of 52 percent.

Episcopal Church In 1966, the TEC had <u>3,647,297</u> members. By 2013, the membership was <u>1,866,758</u>, a decline of 49 percent. (Those numbers should be even lower, though, since those figures by the TEC include <u>breakaway</u> <u>churches</u> trying to leave the denomination.)

Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) (PCUSA)

In 1967, the PC(USA) had 3,304,321 members. In 2013, the membership was 1,760,200, a decline of 47 percent.

United Methodist Church (UMC)

In 1967, the UMC had $\underline{11,026,976}$ members. In 2012, the membership was $\underline{7,391,911}$, a decline of 33 percent.

Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) In 1987, the ECLA had <u>5,288,230</u> members. In 2013, the membership was <u>3,863,133</u>, a decline of 27 percent. (Note: The ELCA was formally constituted in 1988 as a merger of the Lutheran Church in America, the Association of Evangelical Lutheran Churches and the American Lutheran Church.)

American Baptist Churches

In 1967, the ABC/USA had 1,335,342 members. In 2012, the membership was 1,308,054, a decline of 2 percent. (Note: The ABC/USA has been able to stem its decline among white congregants by replacing them with African American and Hispanic members.)

(The above figures are from a March 17, 2015 article by Joe Carter for "The Gospel Coalition")

Given these rather bleak numbers, the issues of sustainability and growth are hot topics these days in mainline churches, including the ELCA. (And it's hardly comforting that the ELCA's losses are not as steep as some of these other denominations!)

What went wrong? Even more importantly: How can we stop and reverse these trends?

As you can well imagine, a lot of soul searching has been done in response to these questions; especially the former one. And there are probably a whole host of reasons why these declines have occurred over the past 50 years or so..

But I am much more interested in that second question about stopping and reversing these trends, especially in the ELCA and, of course, here at Hope. And Jim Collins, I believe, has at least part of the answer, again: "Preserve The Core / Stimulate Progress."

For us, as Christians, the "core" is the gospel, plain and simple; the good news of God's grace, mercy, love and forgiveness demonstrated in and through Jesus Christ. That's the core of what we believe and, therefore, who we are. Everything else is secondary. Everything else, even some of our long-held and most cherished traditions and ways of doing things can and MUST change in response to the rapidly changing world in which we live.

As Collins writes: "Enduring great organizations... have a set of timeless core values and purpose that remain constant over time." The apostle Paul once made the following observation: "For I decided to know nothing among you except Jesus Christ, and him crucified" That's it, in a nutshell. The bottom line. Jesus Christ and him crucified. Stick to that, and the church will not only survive, but thrive. Why? Because that has always been, and will always need to be, our primary and singular focus. And our only hope as well.

"On the other hand," as Collins writes, "they (that is, enduring great organizations) have

a relentless drive for progress – change, improvement, innovation, and renewal. Great organizations keep clear the difference between their core values (which never change), and operating strategies and cultural practices (which endlessly adapt to a changing world)."

Even when the Church has done a good job of "preserving the core" (which I'm not sure it always has!), it has often failed (sometimes miserably) to "stimulate progress." But that's the key, says Collins. That's the dynamic he discovered in researching great organizations. And, therefore, this perhaps needs to be our goal as well as we seek to reach out to a troubled world with the only good news that really matters; the only good news that can truly make a difference in our lives. In the end, only "Jesus Christ, and him crucified" is central to who we are and what we do… Everything else is up for grabs.
