Anchored in Christ, Growing in Faith, Love and Service! We have this hope, a sure and steadfast anchor of the soul....

Sharing the Fragrance of Christ

Therefore be imitators of God, as beloved children, and live in love, as Christ loved us, and gave himself up for us, a *fragrant* offering and sacrifice to God. Ephesians 5:1-2

Parents are a child's first teachers. They watch us intently and then learn from our example; every move we make, every look we display, every action we take, every word we speak. I can even see it in my newborn grandson. Now that he is opening his eyes a little more (!), he just looks and looks, and studies everything and everyone around him; again, especially his mom and dad.

In other words, children are fantastic mimics. They imitate what they see and hear. That's how they learn, of course.

A woman once invited some guests to dinner. At the table, she turned to her six-year-old daughter and said, "Would you like to say the blessing?" The daughter, who was a little shy, replied, "I wouldn't know what to say." Her mom answered, "Just say what you hear Mommy say." So the little girl bowed her head and said, "Lord, why on earth did I invite all these people to dinner!"

The writer of Ephesians, as I shared, encouraged his readers – early Christians – to "be imitators of God, as beloved children…" If God is our heavenly Father, then we are God's children, and it is only natural, it's only logical, that – as God's children – we should be *imitators* of God. That we should mimic and copy everything we see and hear from God. That's how we learn too.

So what is it, then, that we see and hear from God, and we should imitate and mimic in our own lives? Most of all, it is love. But it is also patience and kindness and forgiveness and respect. Over and over again in the Old Testament, we read that God is "slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love."

I mention this only because it seems to me that we are living in a time where there seems to be precious little love, and patience, and kindness, and forgiveness, and respect. We live in a time when we all seem instead to be increasingly *quick* to anger, and utterly *lacking* in steadfast, or enduring, love. Especially in our civil discourse. Especially as we relate to our neighbors and fellow citizens.

As Christians, is this how we are called to live and behave? Does such behavior mimic or imitate the God who is always slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love in response to us and our failings? If not, is there a better way?

The writer of Ephesians thinks that there is. He says: "…live in love, **as Christ loved us**, and gave himself up for us, a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God."

As Christians, therefore, we are called to a higher standard. We are encouraged to behave, not as those around us may at times behave. Rather we are encouraged to follow God's example in Christ. And to live in love as Christ loved us. In a sense, to share some of Christ's **fragrance** with the world.

I told this story in a recent sermon, but it bears telling again. The author Rita Snowden once wrote about her visit to a small town near Dover, England. She was having tea outside, late in the afternoon, when she became aware of an unbelievably pleasant scent filling the air. So she asked her waiter about the source of this scent and was told that it came from the people passing by. He then went on to explain to her that they worked in a perfume factory just down the street, and were on their way home. When they left the factory, he said, they carried with them the fragrance that had permeated their clothing during their day's work.

Rita Snowden immediately saw this as an illustration of what the church could be when we're at

our very best. We should be a people who similarly allow ourselves to be "permeated" with the fragrance of Christ's love and presence, she said. Then, as we go forth in the world and in our daily lives, the fragrance of Christ would go *with us*. And all the people we come into contact with might experience something of God's fragrance *through us*.

That's the hope, at least. That we might share that fragrant offering of love, and patience, and kindness, and forgiveness, and respect with a troubled world where these things often seem to be in such short supply.

Who we mimic and copy matters. It really does. As Christians, we are called to imitate God and no one else...

Finally, Jeanette and I both want to thank the Hope Family for the wonderfully unexpected, but much appreciated, "grandparent's shower"! You kindness will not soon be forgotten. We were truly touched by the gracious gesture.





<u>Hope's Sunday School begins Sunday, September 9 and Wednesday,</u> <u>September 12 and we have some exciting changes:</u>

Sunday Morning Sunday School time is changing – 9:45AM – 10:45AM Wednesday Evenings – 7:00PM – 8:00PM Sunday Morning Worship Times – 8:30AM and 11:00AM <u>note the late</u> <u>service time change!</u>

Wednesday Worship Time – 7:00PM

Format Changes – There are 2 main changes to Sunday School:

1. 7th/8th Grade Confirmation classes will be taught by Pastor Ed Sunday mornings during the 9:45AM SS hour (instead of Sunday evenings).

2. One Sunday/Wednesday per month, from September – May, there will be NO SS class and all children will worship with their families at our regular worship services. These services will be planned with the children in mind. This is NOT meant to be a Sunday or Wednesday "OFF", but a chance for families who cannot fit both SS class and worship into their weekly schedules to be able to bring their children to both.

Sunday, September 23 and *Wednesday, September 26* – No SS class, attend worship as a family.

Sunday, October 14 and *Wednesday, October 17* – No SS class, attend worship as a family... Also celebrating *Bible Sunday* at the worship services.

At-Home Devotions – To help facilitate faith in the home, I am suggesting a daily practice for your family, based on Pastor Rich Melheim's "Faith5":

Sharing Faith at Home:

1. Share your daily highs and lows with each other.

2. Talk about where you might have seen God's presence in your day.

3. Pray for one another's highs and lows, for your family, and the world.

4. Bless one another by tracing the sign of the cross on each other's foreheads or palms.

We continue the following ministries:

<u>Shawl Ministry</u>: a few members knit or crochet shawls or lap robes. A friend of *Debbie Unger*, made a couple after Debbie had given her one of ours. *Ann Rofulowitz* (a former charter member of Grace) is blind. She continues to crochet lap robes. She crochets lap leggings for nursing home patients and recently received a red ribbon at Monmouth County Fair. She was on Cloud Nine. Other members make shawls throughout the year.

Lutheran World Relief Quilts: The cabinet in Fellowship Hall has been designated for fabric, etc., for this ministry. They had been meeting two Tuesdays each month from 9 to 2:30 (except in the summer).

Lutheran World Relief Kits: Each year in September or when the need arises, we prepare LWR kits (health, school, baby, etc) one kit is taken to the NJ Women of ELCA Convention and the remainder are either taken or mailed to the warehouse in Maryland. In the past, *John* and *Joan Drager* have transported quilts/kits to the warehouse and we thank them.

<u>Women of Hope Memorial Scholarship Fund</u>: This fund was established many years ago and continues to be vibrant. Each June, this scholarship is awarded to a graduating senior who is continuing his or her education at the college level and who is a member of Hope. Through many generous donations, this fund has been able to give \$1,000.00 each year. These donations are filtered through Hope's financials with their Treasurer preparing a check quarterly or as needed to our bank account. *Sharon Moffitt* prepares and sends the applications to the qualifying Seniors.

<u>Adopt-a-Family Ministry</u>: This Ministry helps various individuals and families who are in need at Christmas. This is a wonderful way to spread our love. *Cindy Lynch* places a Christmas tree with star/angel ornaments on the tree. These ornaments have dollar amounts for gift certificates. Members purchase and return the gift certificates. Cindy divides these gift certificates among the families and Pastor Ed distributes them.

<u>Butterfly Garden</u>: This garden is located to the right of the main entrance and is in loving memory of *Georgina Bergh*.

<u>Support</u>: We support the New Jersey Women of the ELCA as well as Churchwide. The NJWELCA holds an annual statewide convention and this year it will be held at King of Kings Lutheran Church, 250 Harmony Road, Middletown NJ on Saturday, September 29. Plan to attend. Registration forms are available. The NJWELCA is in need of HELP! Someone to put together the quarterly newsletter which is called the Circular. The board member who was the editor has some health issues, consequently the Circular has not continued since the first quarter of this year. You may check items on their website *njwelca.org*.

Katies Fund: Katies Fund is an endowment fund that supports ministry in three areas: Leadership development, global connections, and living theology.
