Anchored in Christ, Growing in Faith, Love and Service! We have this hope, a sure and steadfast anchor of the soul... A number of years ago, someone made the following observations:

Some churches have parking problems, some other churches don't. Some churches have kids running around making a lot of noise, some other churches tend to be very quiet. Some churches usually have more expenses than money, some other churches don't need to spend much money because not much is going on. Some churches are growing so fast you don't always know everyone's name, in some other churches everybody has known everybody's name for years... Some churches evangelize, some other churches fossilize. Some churches are always planning for the future, some other churches live in the past. Some churches seek new ministries and new methods, some other churches don't want to.

How about Hope? Well... Hope is a church with parking problems, especially during the week when Hope Christian School is in session. Between HCS and also Summer Camp, Hope is also a church with kids running around making a good bit of noise. (You should come visit, for instance, when they're practicing soccer in the narthex during the winter!) And Hope is a church that requires and spends a lot of money because so much *is* going seven days a week. (Check out our 2019 Spending Plan and/or one of our monthly calendars.) Ever since many former Grace members joined Hope, and with the influx of young families having their children baptized here, Hope is also a church where most of us don't always know everyone's name – including me! Moreover, while Hope is clearly a church that fondly remembers and is justifiably proud of its past, it is not a church in any danger of getting *stuck* in that past simply because there's just too much going on right now and too many exciting possibilities to explore. Furthermore, Hope is

a church with so many ministries that sometimes it's too hard to even keep count. And finally, Hope is a church with a history of being open to exploring new ministries and methods.

I would simply add to the list above: Some churches want to *GROW*, while some other churches simply want to maintain the *STATUS QUO*... And it's here, with this choice between growth and the status quo, that we now find ourselves. Will we continue to "dream dreams" and consider the "what ifs" and "what comes next"? Or will we become too comfortable and complacent? These are the crucial questions before us at this time.

It's November, that time of year when, as a congregation, we stop and take stock of where we are, and then try to give some serious thought to where we might be going in the coming year and beyond. Our semi-annual meeting will present us with some choices, especially in the form of a spending plan for 2019 that will guide our efforts and how we spend our money over the next twelve months. Spending plans, of course, are important. But what's even more important are the goals we set for ourselves and the challenges we are willing to take on.

Using once again the "5 Key Issues and Needs" that I have been talking about since my arrival, here are some of my thoughts as I consider the next twelve months:

- 1. STAFFING Our paid staff is now complete. We no longer employ a bookkeeper, but that is something we might want to revisit at some point. But, for now, we have a talented staff in place. One that is collectively doing a great job.
- 2. SYMMETRY I recently asked the Congregation Council to identify for me where they believed I should dedicate my time and efforts in the coming year. The two top priorities they selected were a) Increasing worship attendance, and b) Increasing the involvement of young families. The two are not unrelated, to be sure. "Officially" we have a significant number of young families on our membership rolls. But they are not all, or always, actively engaged and participating; including on Sunday mornings. Turning this around will be one of my chief goals in 2019.

- 3. STEWARDSHIP Because of the financial success of HCS, money is seemingly not a problem for us. But the financial giving (offerings) of our members continues to decline; a disturbing trend. Even with a one million dollar annual budget, there are still potential ministries and projects that we are probably not in a position to seriously explore right now. It comes down to that question of growth vs. the status quo. Growth typically requires financial resources. Do we have them? Will we use them?
- 4. SPACE This is one of the most obvious and critical challenges we face at the moment. By any yardstick, we are clearly "at capacity" in terms of our building usage. Some days, and even some nights, it seems that we are literally bursting at the seams. It takes careful planning and a good deal of flexibility to simply continue to do what we are currently doing. The problem, however, is when we begin to consider, again, the question of growth. There is simply no room – actual physical space – to expand the programs of our congregation or to even accommodate increased participation, for that matter. (Which makes accomplishing the priorities identified in #2 above a bit problematic.) Therefore, how we address this issue of space, or a lack thereof, is going to be key in the coming year and beyond.
- 5. STRATEGY Proverbs 29:18 (KJV) perhaps put it best: "Where there is no vision, the people perish." God is calling us, both individually and collectively, into the greatest mission the world has ever seen: To share the love and forgiveness that is freely given and received through Jesus Christ. There is no higher calling. However, discerning what this will actually look like in our own particular context takes some thought and consideration. This, too, continues to represent one of the key challenges facing us as a congregation as we look to the future. Where are we going? More importantly, where is God leading us?

We have our work cut out for us. But that makes this an exciting time for Hope Lutheran Church. While so many other congregations are literally "dying on the vine," Hope is uniquely poised to explore some exciting ministry opportunities. It doesn't get any better that that!
