#### **CHANGE**

Everything changes, nothing remains without change. (Buddha, 563-483 B.C., founder of Buddhism)

*There is nothing permanent except change.* (Heraclitus, 535-475 B.C., Greek philosopher)

It is not necessary to change... Survival is not mandatory. (W. Edwards Deming, 1900-1993, American statistician and consultant)

The quotes above remind us of one thing: The only unchanging thing in life is change itself! Not only that. Change is not only inevitable and unavoidable, it's also necessary. Why? Because life and living are all about change, that's why. Think about it. From the moment we're born until the day we die we are constantly facing and undergoing change, including and especially in our own bodies! After all, there's no growth or development or maturity without going through an ever-unfolding series of changes; both big and small.

That's not to say that we are always ready and willing to embrace change, however. Sometimes change is difficult; even if it *is* necessary. Moreover dealing with change typically gets harder the older we get. Not always, of course, but often. I know it is sure getting harder for me to deal with change as I age.

So change is not everyone's favorite thing. That's pretty much a given. In fact, as Mark Twain once famously said, "The only person who likes change is a baby with a wet diaper." And, of course, there's also the famous joke: "How many Lutherans does it take to change a light bulb?" Answer: "Change?! What do you mean change?!

But change we must. Even in the church.

Actually, change is at the very foundation of what it means to *be* a Christian. You see, Christ calls us to a new way of thinking; a new way of living. His example of a life guided by love, not hate, by forgiveness, not judgment; by grace and mercy instead of revenge and punishment represents a huge change for us as human beings. He once even said:

Truly I tell you, unless you CHANGE and become like children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven.

(Matthew 18:3)

In other words, unless and until we are able to be trusting like a small child – that is, to have the trusting faith of a child – we will never be able to truly grasp what it means to follow Christ as his disciples. Faith, trusting faith, is at the very heart of what it means to *be* a Christian; at the very heart of our understanding of salvation. And with such a faith comes change...

As we anticipate the end of yet another year, and the beginning of a brand new one, change remains the one constant in life. And 2019 promises to be a time of change for us here at Hope as well. What those changes will be is anyone's guess. But we need not fear the possibility, even the inevitability of change. And that's because we place our lives and our future in the hands of a loving God who promises to be with us always... no matter what!

God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble.

Therefore we will not fear, though the earth should change. (Psalm 46:1-2a)

Prayerfully consider giving a proportion of our substance to support the work of the congregation and The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, live a Christian life in accord with God's Word, assume a ministry of Christ as dictated by our talents. This is our covenant with God and by the help of God.



# Prayer Shawl Ministry submitted by Wanda Nebiolo

The Hope Lutheran Prayer Shawl Ministry under the direction of the Women of Hope began in 2008 and continues to be vibrant. It began after Grace Lutheran, River Edge, NJ sent four prayer shawls for the families of two young boys who were fatally hit by a vehicle while riding their skateboards in Juniper

Farms, February 2008. Several members of the Women of Hope were inspired by this wonderful ministry. *Irene Mihaly* and *Erica Driscoll* began classes for crocheting and knitting. A Thrivent Grant was submitted to the North Shore Thrivent Chapter to help with the purchase of yarn. The Chapter was very generous. The rest is history. Many shawls have been blessed and given to individuals/families who are sick or grieving. When there is a need, just call or stop in to see Pastor Ed or the church office. #### A Note from Support

Now that we have celebrated Black Friday, Shop Small Business Saturday, Cyber Monday, and giving Tuesday, let us turn our attention to: COMMITMENT SUNDAY. This is that time of year when we review our membership and commitment to the ministries at Hope Lutheran and renew our participation by signing the Hope Covenant.

Most of you have picked up your offering envelopes for 2019 and for that we thank you. You will notice that dates are not imprinted on the envelopes, so that if you elect to contribute once a month, you don't need to throw away unneeded envelopes, but can use them for subsequent years. For those of you who DO use the envelopes monthly, thanks very much. NOTE that for 2019, the 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday of the month occurs in March, June, September and December. Extra envelopes are provided in the back of the box for you to include. (We saved ~\$500 from prior years, in choosing the generic envelopes.)

Most of you have NOT, however, submitted the orange "estimate of giving" cards that are available with the offering envelopes. Only 12 have been received to date. We hope you will consider and submit them during Covenant Renewal time. We use them to assess the overall giving health of the congregation, and the data is included in your annual offering statement that is issued at the end of the year.


