## **LENTEN MIDWEEK SERMON SERIES**

DAVID: A Flawed Hero

Of all the people we meet in the Bible, King David was one of the most memorable; a towering figure, in fact. Arguably the most beloved of Israel's heroes, David ruled over the nation during the very zenith of its political and military power and influence and success. And he then cast a giant shadow over the centuries to follow, during which the Israelites were always longing for a return to their former glory under David's leadership; endlessly hoping for someone who could repeat or reproduce what he had done. So great was his impact, and the memories he left behind, that the people of Israel eventually came to believe in and to hope for a "Messiah" who would be a direct descendent of David and who would someday come to reverse their fortunes.

But David, for all his greatness and many accomplishments was a "flawed" hero, however. He was not a perfect man, and he made many tragic mistakes during his lifetime. Yet, in the end, he is still remembered and revered, despite all of his obvious flaws.

David, of course, was the young shepherd boy who became a king. He was the unlikeliest of warriors who defeated the giant Goliath on the field of battle. And he was also the great hero who lost his way and took for himself another man's wife by having her husband killed in a suicide wartime mission. But, nevertheless, in the Augsburg Confession, when it came time for Lutherans to articulate their understanding of what exactly a saint was, the only biblical figure they named was... David. Warts and all. Why? Because even with all of his obvious flaws and shortcomings, David was also a man of great faith who was willing to take ownership of his tragic sins; a flawed hero through whom God could still work God's will.

On Wednesday nights at 7:00 pm during this season of Lent, we will have an opportunity to meet and consider this flawed hero named David, and to see how his life can inform our own. I invite you to join me for this journey.

## **Notes from the Congregation Council**

Some members of our congregation may not be aware of the fact that the council meets on the **third Monday of each month at 7 PM at the church**. Anyone is welcome to attend and we ask that if you are interested in joining us to discuss anything that you please let us know in advance of your plans to attend.

In addition, we can make available to any congregant the reports and minutes that are submitted for each meeting. These documents are available in the office of our HLC administrator, Cheryl Hurd, and also outside of this office in the bin that also holds the bulletins and copies of the Anchor. You may also contact Cheryl or any officer of the council to obtain that information.

As mentioned in the last Anchor newsletter, we are in the midst of phase one of the process as a church family of doing our due diligence to explore potential solutions to our space issues. We are very early in this journey. The next significant step will be to ask you for comments on the work of the Vision and Planning "Dream Team", details of which will be available to you in the near future. The question that will be asked of you is "How are we doing so far?" There will be multiple opportunities to enable you to express your comments.

Once this period of sharing ideas and comments from the congregation is completed, a congregational meeting will be held (date yet to be determined). At this meeting a dialogue will enable all attending to comment on our "wish List", and to **approve or disapprove** moving to phase two of the plan. **If approved**, phase two would involve the formation of a building team and hiring of architects and engineers to further explore the possibilities available to solve our space concerns.

Undoubtedly, as we move forward much comment and conversation will occur. Open communication is the key to fostering understanding and limiting rumor and misinformation about this process. The council will make every effort to communicate with the congregation via the Anchor, email messages, snail mail, and church meetings to keep you informed as our vetting process proceeds.

We ask that any congregant contact members of the council to present concerns, ask questions, and offer opinions so that we can ensure that any misconceptions are addressed and accurate information is presented.

Thank you in advance for your help and interest at this important time in our congregation's history.
