

Minutes from June 25, 2025 Council Meeting

Meeting opened at 7:10pm Attendees – Pastor, Bill, Dave, Mike, Josh, Sue, Brian, Pat, Sarah and Matt via Zoom

Meeting focused on Financial status and building options.

Dave Peters presented detailed reviews of options and costs Council has considered since 2024. He presented options priced at \$300-\$400 sq ft for Hard Costs. Soft Costs would be added expense priced at 25-40%. Parking lot estimated at \$300,000 Data suggests most options not affordable presently.

Total assets as of May 31st between various savings and checking accounts are \$1.4 million

Points to consider:

- * Two classes in Fellowship Hall produce \$65,000 year
- * Each classroom in school generates \$38,000 net based on 40/60
- * Trailer lease expires in 2027
- * Church needs Fellowship Hall
- * 3 new classrooms needed to replace student space presently housed in FH
- * 1 new classroom needed to replace trailer
- * These 4 new classrooms would not increase income, just replace trailer and make FH available for congregation needs

Comments/Suggestions:

Pastor: Need exact sq footage, cost per sq ft, soft costs, size to determine added operating costs

Sarah: Update loan options MIF best option but do not do fixed loans

Mike: What can we afford monthly? Don't want to saddle congregational with financial commitment that might not be affordable. He proposed adding 4 classrooms, bathrooms, restore Fellowship Hall and repair paving.

Brian and Matt: Need more accurate estimates. Brian suggested hiring outside consultant to analyze exactly what can afford. Take middle of road option to get realistic sq ft from a contractor.

Actions:

- * Obtain architectural plan for contractor estimate
- * Connect with churches that have done expansion projects.
- * Update finances


