An invitation to Serve on the Church Audit Committee

The church is seeking dedicated members to serve on the Audit Committee. The Audit Committee plays a crucial role in safeguarding the church's financial integrity, ensuring accountability, and upholding transparent stewardship of church resources. Historically this audit is an annual requirement.

Our Hope constitution states that:

"An audit committee of two or more voting members shall be elected by the Congregation Council at its first meeting following the November annual meeting of the congregation. Audit Committee members shall not be members of the Congregation Council."

The plan is to conduct this audit in early 2026.

Purpose of the Audit Committee

The Audit Committee is responsible for reviewing the church's financial processes, internal controls, and annual financial statements. The committee works independently to provide oversight and recommendations for improvement, fostering trust and confidence among the congregation.

Committee Responsibilities

- Review and evaluate the church's financial reports and statements.
- Assess the effectiveness of internal controls and procedures.
- Make recommendations for improving financial practices.
- Report findings to the church leadership and congregation.
- Assist in working with external accounting firm, if necessary.
